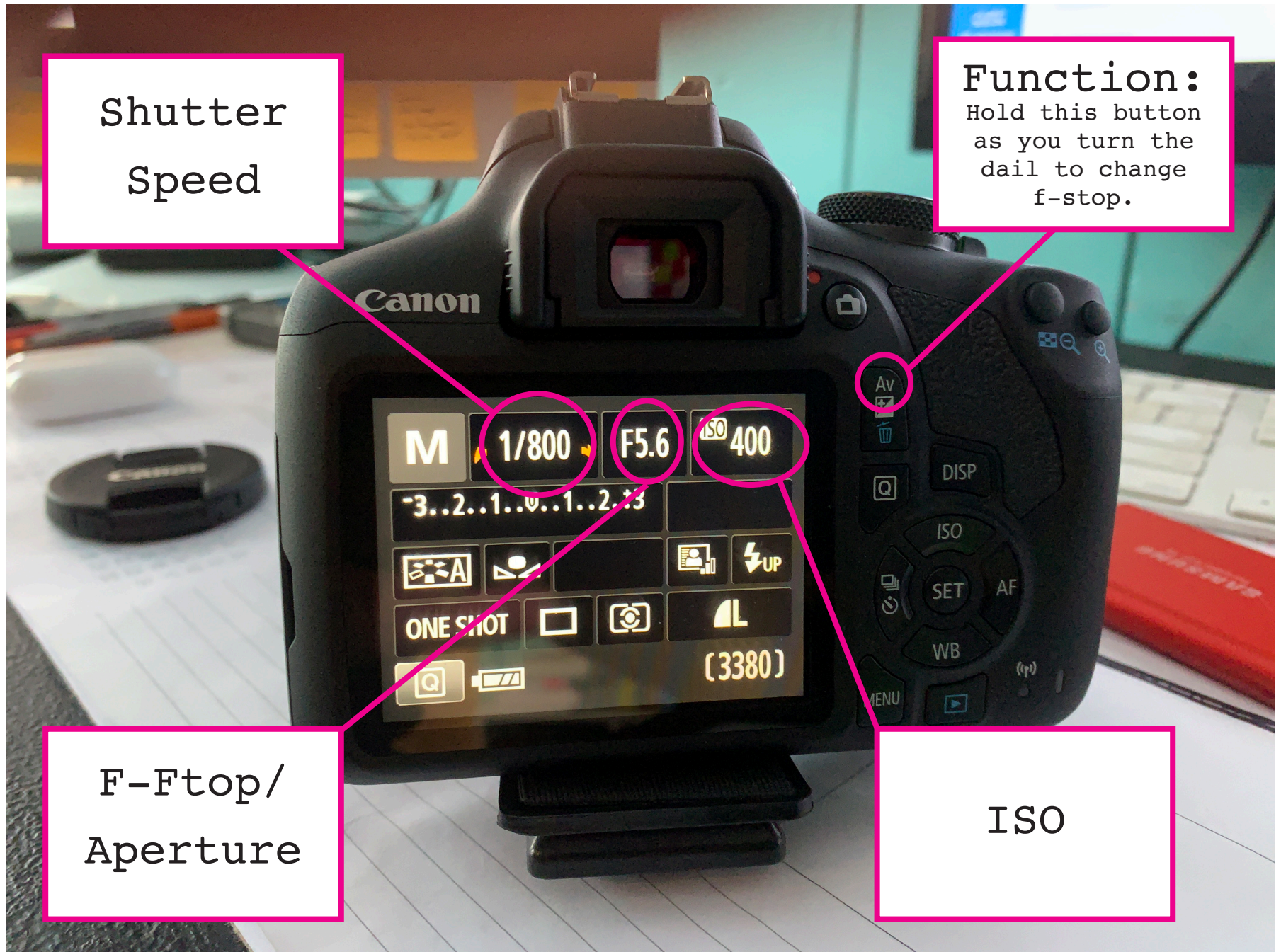


Shutter

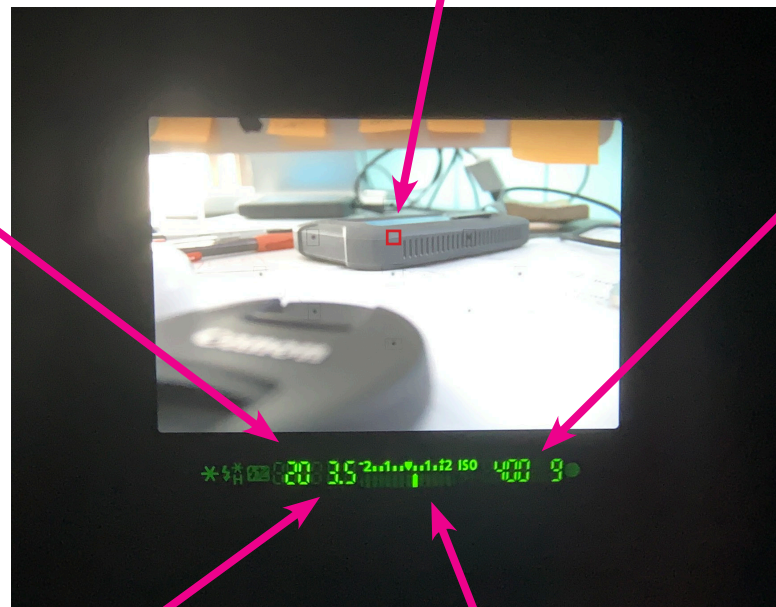


## Focus:

If you half-press the shutter button, you should see the focus indicator when lens is set to AF (auto-focus).

## Exposure:

This little indicator will move to the left and right as you change settings. Try to get it to stay in the middle to get a good exposure.

## Modes :

Keep it on Manual if you can. It'll take some practice to change settings on the fly. Keep at it!

## Shutter Button

## Dial :

Turn to change shutter speed or hold the function button as you turn to change your F-Stop.





## Slow Shutter:

The shutter door can stay open for a pretty long time. This could help in low-light, but you'll need to keep you camera VERY STEADY.

Any movement will make the image blurry.



## Exposure:

This indicator will slide left and right.

Getting it in the middle will let you know you have a good exposure.

This one is OVER-EXPOSED.



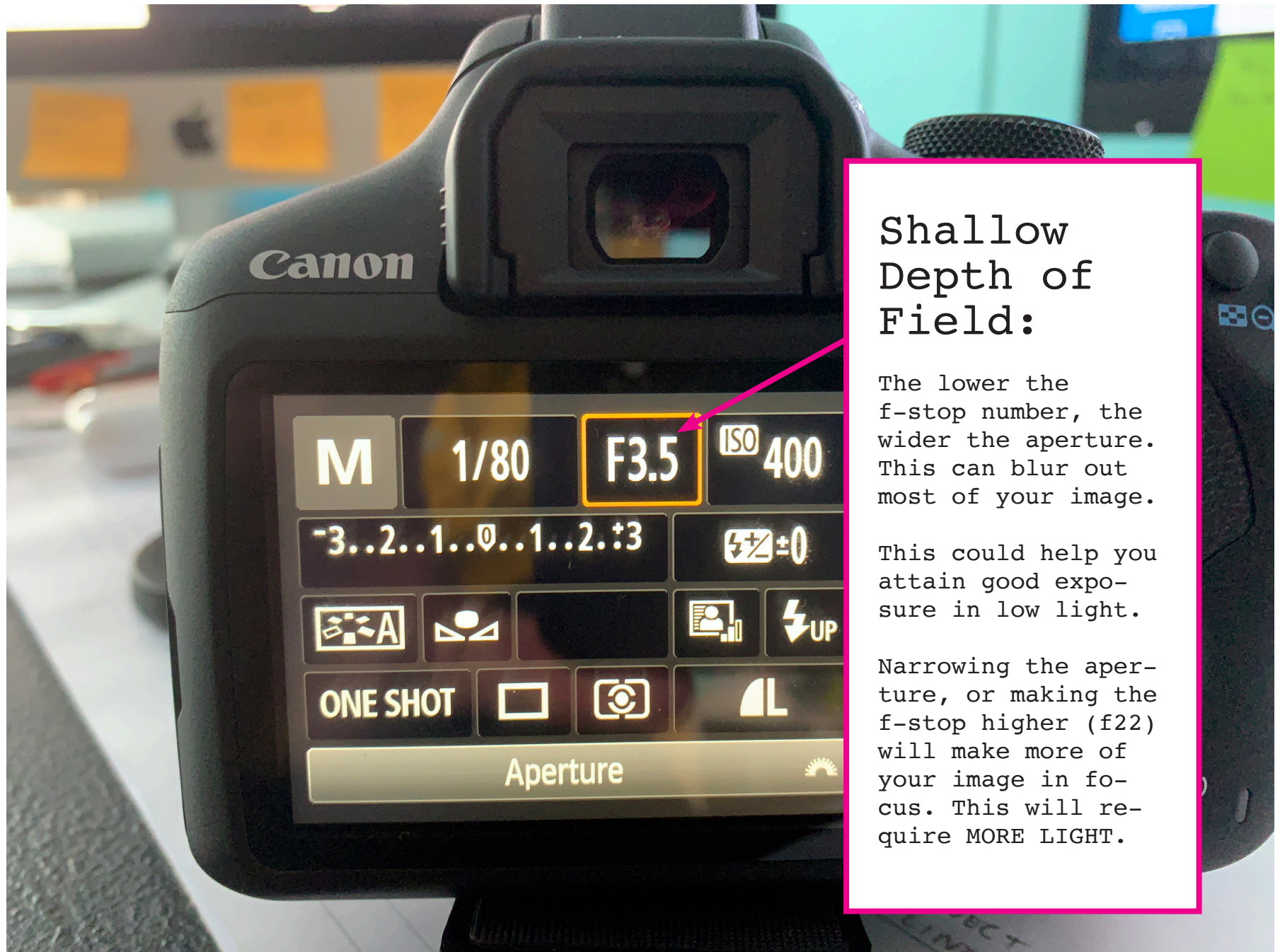


## Fast Shutter:

The shutter door can open and close very fast. This will let you freeze motion.

You'll need A LOT OF LIGHT. Try shooting with a fast shutter outside during the day.





## Shallow Depth of Field:

The lower the f-stop number, the wider the aperture. This can blur out most of your image.

This could help you attain good exposure in low light.

Narrowing the aperture, or making the f-stop higher (f22) will make more of your image in focus. This will require MORE LIGHT.
